A Message from Wolverhampton Fair Traid

I'm sure you will have heard that Traidcraft has indicated that the business is currently in the process of consultation about its future viability. Unless an alternative business model can be found, the company will wind up operations at the end of December 2018 as its current model is no longer viable. You may be aware that Traidcraft has struggled to be profitable for several years but has been particularly hard-hit by the fall of the pound immediately following the Brexit referendum. The company also ran into difficulties when it launched its new website at the end of last year and is no different from other High Street names which have been hit by the recession. They have asked for expressions of concern or suggestions for a way forward to be directed to lovetraidcraft@traidcraft.co.uk. Meanwhile, the message from Traidcraft is to pray for their personnel as the business seeks a way forward and to make this autumn their best sales season ever. We should also be very mindful of the impact that this news will have on the growers and producers who sell their products to Traidcraft on fair trade terms. Traidcraft has beautiful, high quality and handcrafted items in their 'Create' range. If you enjoy shopping on the web, do browse through their online catalogue. Wolverhampton Fair Traid stocks a wide range of their craft products and if you are within striking distance of Wolverhampton, do call in for a browse. Meanwhile, Traidcraft Exchange, the sister organisation to Traidcraft plc, continues to work. The charity raised over £1million through their 'Hidden Entrepreneurs' campaign this spring and continues to work on their tea campaign. It is important for us as churches not to allow this news from Traidcraft to overwhelm us but encourage us to prayerfully redouble our efforts to make trade fair for the worlds poorest communities. Wolverhampton Fair Traid would like to support churches in the District. The shop sources its products from a number of suppliers and will continue trading as normal, albeit with the loss of some favourite items, should Traidcraft indeed cease trading. The shop offers a sale or return facility to organisations (several of our Methodist churches already use this) and we would be happy to help you stock your church kitchen with fair trade items.
