# God in Love Unites Us

During this church year, all Methodist people are being invited to join conversations to study and consult on the report to the 2019 Methodist Conference called "God in Love Unites Us" which was presented by the Marriage and Relationships Task Group. Conversations will be happening at various locations around our Circuit and at the February Circuit Meeting and I really want to encourage you to take part.

It is easy to think that the report is all about same-sex marriage. The report and resolutions do include that but a lot more besides. The report firstly considers where relationships fit into our understanding of what is to be human and how we are created as relational beings leading to a discussion of what God has in mind for good relationships. The report then continues to consider this in the context of the Christian character of marriage and how it relates to the legal institution of marriage and considers extending our practice of marriage to include same-sex couples. The report concludes by thinking about how we can live together as one church while recognising our different convictions. Within all of this the report also considers areas such as what we do when marriages end, co-habitation, civil partnerships and singleness.

As many of you know I have been a regular member of Conference as this report has progressed. I have been deeply moved by the commitment, grace and love shown in our discussions. Great care has been taken to move away from a polemical argument to one in which we can learn from each other and move forward together as a church. The purpose of our local conversations is not to present "sides" in the debate, but to study the report and its recommendations, to learn from each other and hold each other in love finding the grace of God between us.
