

The last few months have been tough for all of us grappling with the impact of COVID19. As the government advised us to stay home to stay safe, we were fully aware that home is simply not safe for everyone. We had to quickly adapt the way we work to continue delivering safe services to victims fleeing abuse during lockdown.

With teams working frontline in our accommodation and from home, our services have not been on lock-down and our mantra has been "duty of care never sleeps". Read more about how we have been impacted and some of the specific ways in which we adapted.



As we rebuild, recover and continue to reach out for your support, listen as Jemma from our children and young persons team talks about how we have been supporting

children and young people in the height of COVID19.

We support over 100 children and young people in accommodaiton at any one time. Amongst other things, fostering a continued love for learning has been a core part of the services we have provided for children during lockdown. Families have been able to utilise educational packs we provide, as well as our in-house library service; borrowing books on a weekly basis and completing book reviews afterwards.

"Sammy's" mum said that she always gets her homework ready without prompting when she has a 1-2-1 session scheduled with us and "Sammy" now likes to read a book to her every night, before she goes to bed.
