Sermon 'Inasmuch'

We look out on our world with fear and despair at the state of government, the pantomime of the US election, and the disfunction in Downing street, the removal of human rights in Hong Kong; the conflicts in Ethiopia. Armenia and Azerbaijan, the instability in the middle East, Syria, Israel-Palestine and parts of Africa. We long for good leadership.

The lesson from Ezekiel is all about that, the failure of the leaders of Judah, in the time of the exile, and the return. According to the prophet they have failed as the shepherds of God's people, His sheep. So God promises to be a faithful shepherd and care for His people and their needs, and bring back David, the shepherd, the Messiah to care for the sheep and judge the sheep who behave selfishly. It is a passage of judgment and hope.

Matthew ch 25 is a chapter about Judgment, illustrated in parables, the parable of the 10 girls, the parable of the talents, and the parable of the sheep and the goats, which is ours for today. This parable cuts to the centre of our lives as disciples. Its words are direct and clear.

Firstly, we are not judged on our beliefs or religious practice, but on our actions to our fellow human beings, feeding the hungry and thirsty, caring for the homeless and the stranger, the needy and the sick, the outcast and prisoners. Nor do we distinguish between those deserving of it, for in each is the presence of Christ, and all are made in the Image of God. The judgment is stark. When we do it, we are commended, when we fail condemned. There is not a tally, nor is there comparison. There is not a number which means we have succeeded. It never ends. The smallest act of kindness means we have served God. Those times when we've failed to respond, because we are tired, or too busy, or hungry, or preoccupied, are God's judgment on us.

The question is raised, 'Does this mean that people are separated, and a few go to heaven and the rest of us go to hell? I hope not. These are parables to illustrate the Gospel. I believe the truth is we are all sheep and goats. We do and we fail to do. But it is all a response to the Grace of God. The parable is not about the end of time, but about now. How we respond to the Gospel, which is of God's love for us in Jesus, His living and dying and rising, His forgiving and healing, to which love we respond as His children, seeking to live out that Gospel in our caring, and so seeking His Kingdom, where all need is satisfied. So, there is hope for our world, and for its people, and for us.
