#### All Age Talk

Can you believe that only yesterday we were celebrating the birth and the arrival of Jesus?!

Now I want you all to blink once. [Demonstrate blinking and wait for others to do so].

You see in that blink of an eye we come to today's Bible readings and in our Gospel reading for today, Jesus is going to be twelve years old. Wow, didn't that time fly by? Jesus was just like each one of us. He lived and aged on this earth. He had birthdays just like us.

Jesus went to worship, Jesus travelled with his family, Jesus made his mom and dad worry. Have you ever done something mom and dad were worried about? Jesus was a part of growing up, learning, experiencing smells, and touch and sound just like us.

And that is also what the word Emmanuel means. God is with us. God is with us. So even in the small and the big and the difficult things, like when we worry our parents, and in the joys and the sadness of life the truth is that God is with us. What is important as we come away from Christmas is that just like the toy we've been given this year, its not just for Christmas. Christ (Jesus) is for all year round and we need to remember that He is with us every step we make, regardless of what age we are.

Let us pray. [You might like to invite the congregation, or perhaps just the children in the congregation, to say each line after you. Pause after each full stop in the prayer to allow them to repeat the line back to you].

God, help us to walk with you as we grow up. Thank you that you are with us in the big days and in the little days. Help us to know you and to keep the words of love you give in our hearts.

#### Reflections on the reading

'They grow up fast, don't they' – it's one of the typical lines people say to youngish parents, as the children seem to add an extra inch every time you look in the opposite direction. Or perhaps one of the things you might say to the person sitting next to you in church when that child you remember being a babe in arms is now doing one of the readings, or preaching the sermon...

And the gospel story for today certainly feels like that moment for Joseph and Mary's little family – just yesterday ago we were all celebrating the miracle of the virgin birth and now the young lad's turned twelve!

But this is a week with lots of parallels – the couple walking away from Jerusalem who have lost Jesus find despair, and then great joy. Is this Luke setting up the end of his Gospel when Cleopas and his friend (or wife?) are walking away from Jerusalem despondent and encounter the risen Jesus?

And the final verse of the Samuel reading shows a definite parallel with Jesus – both young boys are said to be 'growing in stature and favour with the Lord.' Both of them have a large task ahead of them and as 2021 draws to a close, we look into the

future of 2022 and see our own parallels with the story that Samuel and Jesus have ahead of them.

They must both step out into deeply unjust societies filled with corruption and poor leadership. In that context, they must both offer a different kind of leadership style that enables others to grow but also offers a corrective to the broken system they are in. The verses we skipped out of the Samuel reading (following the lectionary) shows the levels of corruption and malpractice in the religious institution he is growing up in, and if you've heard any of the Gospel stories you will know that Jesus' time was equally immoral. As these boys become men, they will have much work to do to build the kingdom where they are.

This begs the question for us – how are we responding? How are we building the kingdom where we are? How are we letting go of our own plans and aims and selfish desires, in order to allow God to move within us?

As we are in this 'in-between Sunday', which is both the sixth day of Christmas and the day before New Year, what are we looking to be a part of in 2022? How are we going to be involved in making the world a better place, how can we bring Christ closer?

As 2022 dawns, can we continue to grow in stature and favour with the Lord? However old we are, however long we have been on this journey with God, let us make 2022 a year of growth, where we seek to experience new things, we open ourselves up to the encounter with the incarnate God, and we commit our lives to channeling the divine into our everyday lives.<sup>4</sup>

So, as we recognize our own imperfections, let us be tolerant and understanding when we see faults in others. Above all, keep us loving, because we know that will help us to overcome many of the problems we create when we judge others more harshly than we judge ourselves.

Love conquers all may sound like a trite statement, but you proved it to be true in the life and death of Jesus. Help us always to remember that.

Then as we move on, let us take the peace of Christmas on into the New Year. Let us remind ourselves that the words and mission of Jesus are now ours and that we can continue to find strength and guidance in them.

So we celebrate and sing of peace and joy, love and forgiveness and thank you for all your goodness towards us. May that joy spill out from this church to infect the world with its grace.
