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Opening Prayers

Here I am Lord, come to encounter you.

Come, Lord God, and may I be open to your presence. Shine in my heart, transform me by your love and your grace, that my face might shine with your glory, that your love might be all around me.

Lord of light, come here, by your grace.

In Jesus' name I pray.

Readings: 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2; Luke 9:28-36

Responding to the reading

These two passages – from Luke's Gospel and a passage from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians – unpack the amazing moment of the Transfiguration, and what it might mean for us today. They speak of God's glory as something that materially changes us and the world around us. In this story, we see the power and might of God, revealed in Jesus.

The story of the transfiguration, and the impact it has on the disciples, reminds us that we are called to be witnesses to God's power and God's love for us.

In response to God's goodness, we are called to share our praise and worship, so that others too might know of how good God is.

In today's world, there are many people who are facing the fear of persecution, or the threat of conflict. These challenges can be overpowering, and it can be hard to believe that God might transform the situation. As we stand alongside those facing the threat of persecution, we are called to be witnesses, and to believe that, in the words of the psalmist, the Lord might "give strength to his people" and "bless his people with peace". Through our words and actions, we can show that we believe God is more powerful. This could be anything from attending rallies, engaging with political structures or using our consumer power to call for change.

In Xinjiang, China, Uyghur Muslims are facing persecution based on their religion and culture. An estimated one million people have been detained by the Chinese Government, put into labour camps or moved to other regions to labour. They have been subject to human rights abuse, and forced by the fear of threat into detainment, family separation and forced labour.

Around 20% of the world's cotton is produced in the Xinjiang region in China. This cotton used internally in China as a raw product and then exported around the world as threads, fabrics and garments. Potentially, around 80 brands are directly or indirectly benefitting from the forced labour of Uyghur Muslims in Xinjiang. This includes high street brands many of us are familiar with, such as Adidas, Nike and Gap.

We need greater transparency on how cotton production is playing a part in the persecution of Uyghur Muslims in Xinjiang. One of the ways we can be a force for good against human rights abuse in supply chains is by choosing to buy from companies which uphold high ethical standards, and to hold the companies we shop with to account on their standards.

Could you use the template letter prepared for us by our friends at the Joint Public Issues Team (JPIT) to write to one of the high street brands you shop with to ask them what their ethical standards are?

Often, writing to a company on an issue is more likely to persuade them to control the ethical sourcing of their products, as opposed to simply avoiding them as a retailer. Showing that we care about the way fear, threat and discrimination play a part in our world is one way of witnessing that we believe God wants better for humanity. Through our actions, we are able to communicate that every person is worthy of dignity because they are created in God's image. God's power and might stretches beyond the fear and threat of this world, and brings justice and peace.
