Beckminster Method Lent 2022 Week 5 Passiontide (the name for the last two weeks of Lent)

Philippians 4: 4 - 9, John 12: 1 - 8

'Whatever is true, whatever is just, whatever is pleasing or worthy, think on these things'

Lent is a time to rethink our lives.

We continue with Jesus as he reaches Bethany on his fateful journey to Jerusalem. He has reached the house of his friends and Mary performs a lavish act — no second-rate soap to wash Jesus's feet but an expensive fragrant perfume. He had, of course, raised her brother from the dead and she offers on her knees her most valued possession and no doubt her love.

Judas' interjection however leads us to consider the delicate balance between worship and social justice. How can her costly act be justified when so many were living in poverty? Our spend on ourselves and church property needs to be held in tension with our calling to serve the poor, to welcome the stranger and the refugee. But in her anointing of Jesus's feet, Mary reminds us that we are called to fragrant worship as well as to wash one another's feet acts of love and kindness where no expense is spared.

Paul exhorts to think on the good things that we are doing and to keep on doing them, for God is faithful and we shall find His peace in our giving.

A Breath Prayer (for Ukraine) (from 'Days to Lament'—Embrace the Middle East) Ekah! How can this be?

With this cry we offer our own wordless pain, Our neighbour's inexpressible suffering, Our world's endless groaning, And our lingering hope To the Silent One. Ekah! How can this be? (Lm1;1)
