PAUL'S £5 CHALLENGE: As part of my sermon on Harvest Sunday, 28 September, I gave you a challenge to increase the seed money from £5 as part of our centenary fundraising appeal. Some of you asked for an envelope containing £5 to bring back on 11 January 2026 with the increase achieved. Envelopes are still available from Sue Lorimer.

I also gave a second challenge to read on a daily basis the first 100 chapters of the New Testament, taking us from Matthew chapter one to the Book of Acts of the Apostles chapter 10. Each time you forget to read a chapter, you put a £5 into an envelope. At the end of the exercise, you look at how much money you have made and bring it to church on Sunday, 11 January 2026.

This exercise is voluntary and is meant to be fun and enjoyable. But at the same time, there is the seriousness of reading our Bible and raising some funds for the church.
